#### SPONSOR AN ORPHAN

#### KENYA, GHANA, INDIA and NEPA

Every child deserves access to life's basic necessities and an education. Sponsor an orphaned child and you'll provide him or her with something as meaningful as shoes, meals, school tuition, uniforms and books.





#### **MAKE THE DIFFERENCE**

**\$7** will buy a child a pair of shoes.

**\$30/month** will support a primary school orphan for a year.

**\$350/month** will provide food and care for 30 preschool orphans.



# Environmental Youth Action Corps





Environmental Youth Action
Corps train local youth to be
environmental advocates and
educators. These young people, in
turn, teach their local
communities about the humancaused sources of pollution and its
effects upon public health.

#### Topics include:

- the toxic chemical hazards of burning plastics
- preventing soil poisoning through improper disposal of batteries containing lead, mercury and cadmium
- the importance of planting trees for biodiversity and general health of the planet

#### **MAKE THE DIFFERENCE**

\$20 trains a young person as an environmental advocate. They receive a button, a certificate, trees to plant and a solar flashlight. This new EYAC member then continues to educate the community and keep their local area clean.

#### **FEED VILLAGES**

The **Feed Villages** project promotes sustainable farming education and hands-on training at demonstration farms and tree nurseries. Several garden beds are dedicated for seed growth to promote biodiversity, teach seed saving practices, and build a seed bank for future crop production. Seedlings from the nurseries are planted to restore tree cover to villages.



These farms and nurseries are not only models for healthy, practical and sustainable agricultural techniques, but all food produced is donated to schools, orphan homes, and vulnerable families.

#### MAKE THE DIFFERENCE

**\$27** trains a woman in bio-intensive farming and provides her with tools and seeds. Training women in sustainable agriculture and drought farming increases food production by 2-6 times normal yield.



#### **GIVE THE GIFT OF CLEAN WATER**

Over a million families in Kenya alone have no clean water. Tragically, 60% of the deaths there are attributed to waterborne illness and children suffer the highest mortality rate.

Locally produced, low-cost water filters like those made at the new plant in Kiminini, Kenya, vastly improve public health by providing clean drinking water. The filters also support sustainable economic development as local people fully manage production, distribution and public health education in rural villages.



#### **MAKE THE DIFFERENCE**

**\$20** provides one ceramic water filter to an orphan home, school, feeding program or clinic. Each ceramic water filter supplies water for 6-8 people per day that is 99.88% free of waterborne pathogens.

#### Kick It with Kenya!





Kick It with Kenya (KIWK) is an annual Kenyan youth conference and soccer tournament that empowers participants through leadership forums on HIV/AIDS awareness. KIWK also provides participants and spectators with testing, counseling and general health services.

KIWK promotes team effort and good sportsmanship for hundreds of young people each year. Each event held thus far has built a strong sense of community for both players and spectators.

#### **MAKE THE DIFFERENCE**

\$25 provides a young person with a health and dental check up as well as a uniform.



#### SUPPORT A TAYLOR - DONATE A SCHOOL UNIFORM

The **Dzidefo Women's Cooperative** is a small textile cooperative of young women from the Volta Region of Ghana who make toddler clothing, home accessories (such as laundry bags and cushion covers), and school uniforms. The fabric used is pure Ghanaian cotton, locally designed and printed using authentic traditional Ghanaian patterns and handdyed woodblock prints. Income generated by the cooperative's work goes toward the women's daily essentials like food, medication, and educational fees.

#### **MAKE THE DIFFERENCE**

**\$20** buys a school uniform for a needy child, the cost of which is often prohibitive for many parents, particularly single mothers and orphans' caregivers. The cooperative works closely with local schools and offers uniforms to the children in the most need.

#### **EMPOWER AN ENTREPENEUR**

KENYA, GHANA, INDIA and NEPA

Empower women to create viable businesses using their existing skills. The village micro-credit program enables cooperatives to provide small loans to entrepreneurs who are unable to qualify for traditional bank loans. The loans are typically short-term (a year or less), are not secured by collateral, and require repayment in weekly installments to be re-loaned in the community.



For every \$100 donated, a loan will be made to a village cooperative to assist women in starting small businesses to better support their families.

Spread Public Health Awareness in Kenya and Ghana





Educate, empower, and inspire African youth through the **Youth Outreach Mentors (YOM)** program. Once trained, the mentors promote gender equality and increase awareness about HIV/AIDS. They also provide counseling for HIV positive people and teach them how to prevent transmission of the virus through healthy lifestyle practices.

\$10 trains a young person as a Youth Outreach Mentor. YOM is a highly effective grassroots solution for public health awareness.



True Colors trains Kenyans to produce products for international markets and earn enough income to support themselves and their families. Using traditional regional skills, local men and women handcraft uniquely beautiful handbags from goatskin and other first class Kenyan leathers.



True Colors' owner, Steven Klatte, designed the Sokoni Bag in honor of his 10 week volunteer experience at Common Ground through Village Volunteers. Sokoni means market and this bag combines exclusive leathers with recycled materials emphasizing cultural tradition as well as sustainability.

The Butterfly Project scholarship provides vital support, mentoring and funding for young East African women. These young women are committed to serving in their rural communities through careers in education or nursing but lack the necessary financial resources.



Nancy Atieno Olambo, one of this year's nine scholarship winners wrote:

"It is still a great problem for a girl to be educated in the village. Most parents believe that it is a waste to educate a girl because they feel that girls never aspire to higher levels. When I stand out as a qualified professional lady through my school, no parent will still be willing to keep their daughters at home. They will make sure girls are taken to school". – Nancy
